She helps patients return to their previous level of function by treating pain c any disability associated with a cancer diagnosis, treatment and beyond. Dr. Maltser tr common conditions which cause difficulty with daily activities such as post-mastectom pain, lymphedema, shoulder pain and weakness. She works with patients diagnosed w breast, head and neck, brain, spine and sarcoma cancers. Dr. Maltser works with a multidisciplinary team including physical, occupational, lymphedema and speech therapists. The ultimate goal of her practice is to focus on the highest quality of life fo cancer patients and survivors.

Dr. Susan Maltser graduated from New York College of Osteopathic Medicine. She sen as Director of Cancer Rehabilitation at Northwell Health; Chief, Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Long Island Jewish Medical Center; and Assistant Professor, Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Donald and Barbara Zucker School of Medicine at Hofstra Northwell.

# **Under 40, Young Women's Support Group (Online)**

# TIME-LIMITED, TOPIC-FOCUSED, PSYCHOEDUCATIONAL BREAST CANCER GROUPS



We are proud to present our new **4-week, time-limited, topic-focused, psychoeducational grou**Our groups will dig into some of the topics that are frequently brought up by patients and survivors.

Throughout **4 consecutive weeks** we will review topics (such as sex and intimacy, nutrition, talking to your children, men with breast cancer, etc.) and support one another while they are discussed. The group meet for 90 minutes. Participants will focus on a specific topic each week.

Each group will accommodate only **10 members**. You **must** register to attend the group. All members must commit to attending an **entire 4-week session**.



# UJA Federation - New York FREE GENETIC TESTING FOR THE BRCA MUTATION

This is a new study which offers FREE testing to identify biomarkers for carrying a BR( (BReast CAncer) genetic mutation. **This study is available to you until December 2019.** 

This testing is offered through **BFOR** (BRCA Founder Outreach Study), an independer research initiative that aims to facilitate access to testing for women and men age 25 older with at least one grandparent of Ashkenazi (Eastern European) ancestry. This Jewish demographic is at least 10 times more likely than the general population to inh BRCA mutations. And notably, 90% of those at risk do not know they are BRCA-positive.

The testing -- offered at no cost to the participant -- can be completed at your nearest Quest Diagnostics lab. While requiring little investment of time, effort, or money, it will provide invaluable information to help reduce cancer risks and improve outcomes for those who carry a BRCA mutation. In short, participation may benefit one's personal health and, by advancing cancer research, enhance the welfare of the Jewish commur at large.
